With Christmas just around the corner it's time to reflect on what has been a busy and exciting term for the Maths Hub.

Mathematics education has been placed firmly in the spotlight with the announcement of extra government funding in the Chancellor Philip Hammond's budget speech, acknowledging the crucial role maths plays in preparing young people for future employment.

The additional funding is for the following:

- To expand the Teaching for Mastery maths programme into a further 3,000 schools
- To reward schools and colleges who support their students to study maths by giving them £600 for every extra pupil who decides to take Maths or Further Maths A levels or Core Maths
- To nurture top mathematical talent by opening additional maths schools
- To test innovative approaches to improve GCSE Maths resit outcomes

This announcement is a welcome one with some of the funding directly supporting maths hubs projects.

Last month saw the return leg of this year's England-China Exchange Programme, with Kerry Bateman from Sturton-by-Stow hosting our two visiting teachers, Yan and Vincent. Over 200 colleagues came along to observe Year 2 and Year 6 lessons. The pupils did a brilliant job, showing off their reasoning and deep thinking skills, and having the confidence to become 'little teachers' even with 50 extra adults in the room. Having the opportunity to see Teaching for Mastery in practice provided inspiration and insight for our primary colleagues.

Years 5-8 Continuity development workgroup-Multiplicative Reasoning

A few spaces are available on this work group which will focus on deepening pupil's understanding of the multiplicative mathematics crucial to support progress. Fractions, ratio and proportion have been given a much greater focus in the recent KS2 and KS3 curriculums, a trend also reflected in the new GCSE exams. This Work Group model allows KS2 and KS3 teachers to work together, using specifically designed lessons and research-based professional development materials to focus on the most effective teaching and learning approaches in this area.
